Elder Johnnie L. Mouning is the Assistant Pastor of Christ Chapel New Testament Church. He was born on July 3, 1938, in Greenville, N.C. to the parents of Deacon John and Mrs. Naomia Mouning ; the second son of a family of four: and founder of St. John Community Church of Bridgeport, CT; younger brother, Bishop Curtis E. Mouning, Pastor and founder of Gospel Temple Church of Bridgeport, CT; and younger sister, Mrs. Sarah L. Mouning Gibbs, of Bridgeport, CT.

He was married on August 26, 1957, to the former Miss Thelma L. Lofton, of Greenville, N.C.; the father of four sons: Marvin presently stationed in West Berlin, Germany; Gregory, Jeffrey, and Kenneth of North Branford, CT. He and his family moved to Connecticut in 1959 where he accepted employment at Yale University.

Elder Mouning received his S.A. and B.S. degrees from Quinnipiac College in Hamden, CT. Further study has been taken at Yale Divinity School.

He is the editor of a book, The 39th Annual National Youth Convention, for Apostolic Faith Church of God, Inc; and figure for Atlas of Molecular Structures in Biology, Ribonuclease - S, Clarendon Press, Oxford, England 1973. He is author of Our Trip to Europe and the British Isles Summer of 1982, in preparation. He is co-author of three books: The Mouning Saga, Our Great Adventurous Trip to the West Coast in 1968 and To Nova Scotia, Cape Breton and Prince Edward Island. Elder Mouning and his family have traveled extensively throughout America and abroad. He is employed as an Associate in Research with the Professor F.M. Richards, in the Department of Molecular Biophysics and Biochemistry at Yale University.
